Medicare Open Enrollment

Every year, Medicare's open enrollment period is **October 15** - **December 7.**

Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year—things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. Open enrollment is when all people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs.

People in a Medicare health or prescription drug plan should always review the materials their plans send them. If their plans are changing, they should make sure their plans will still meet their needs for the following year; or if they're satisfied that their current plans will meet their needs for next year. If their plan is still being offered, they don't need to do anything.

October 2: **Rosemary's Baby** 137 min.


